- ❖ Post assignments and homework links
- ❖ Post syllabus and course expectations
- ❖ Post due dates via calendar
- ❖ Post class news events
- ❖ Reaching out to students and parents
- ❖ How to contact teacher
- ❖ It is 21st Century Communication

Why a teacher website?

School Websites

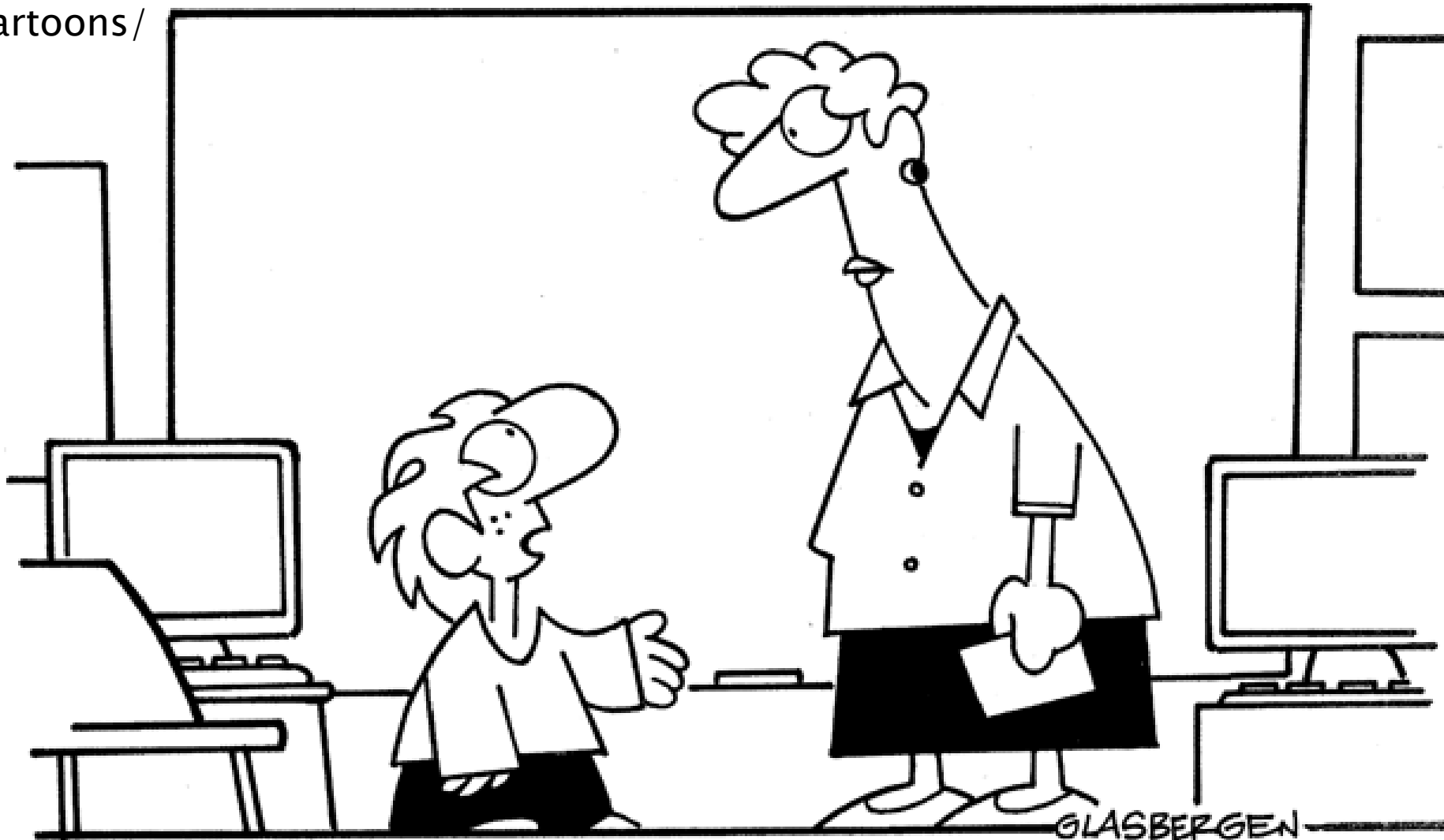
- ❖ Create Distance Education assignments
 - ❖ Including videos, podcasts, third party resources
- ❖ Create test prep assignments
- ❖ Develop assignments for students with special needs, English Language Learners, and students studying from home.
- ❖ Links to textbook resources

Teacher website versus school provided website?

- Do you need written permission to host your own site?
- Is there a space limit on the school website?
- School policy?
- Cost- setup and monthly fees
- Features
- Upgrade
- Space for videos, podcasts, links
- Access to 'blocked' sites, i.e. Facebook, Youtube
- Social media
- Knowledge of student accessibility to a website
- Digital divide- access from home/library

Privacy issues: School and Teacher Website

- **Student photographs**
 - **Media release from parents-school approved (get an administrator signature)**
 - **ID of students in images, videos, etc**
 - **Copyrights and permissions**
 - **Give credit on all posted images, materials**
 - **Access to Facebook, MySpace, other third-party links. Do we or don't we?**
 - **Sharing email addresses**

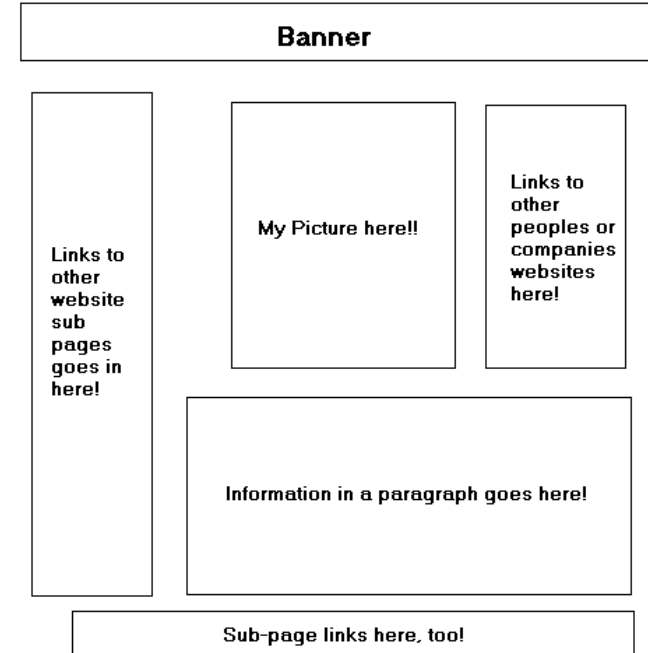
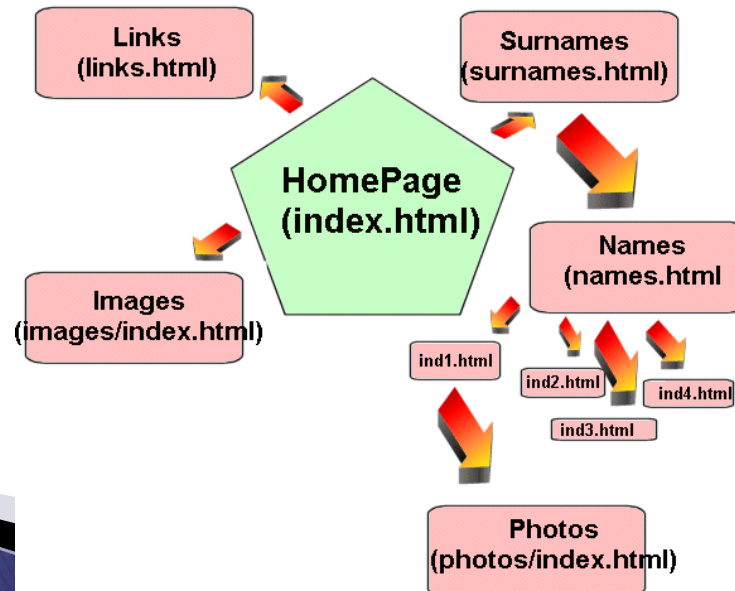
